¹Semarnat defines an UMA as all the pieces of land and registered facilities that operate in conformity to the approved management plan and in which permanent follow-up is done to monitor the state of the habitat and the populations or samples that are found there. ²The PAMS implies the delimiting of an area (ejidos, municipalities, or even states) for the management of species of interest, determining the management methods and population surveys. Thus, the difference between an UMA and a PAMS is that the first seeks integrated exploitation of resources, while the second focuses on a specific resource.
